SPECIALTY AREA REQUIREMENTS

A student pursuing this major will consult with a designated advisor in the Department of Language and Literature to design a major program of study that meets the requirements listed below. The student will be admitted to the major after the proposal has been designed and approved.

The specialty area must meet the following criteria:

- The major must include a minimum of 36 hours plus the 3-hour capstone course.
The student must select courses from four separate disciplines chosen from the list below.
A minimum of nine credit hours must be taken from each of the four selected disciplines.
At least 18 hours of the major must be in upper division (300 and 400 level) courses.
The student and advisor will select an appropriate capstone course from one of the four disciplines.
The student must achieve a minimum major GPA of 2.0.
A minimum of 120 hours are required for graduation. General electives may be needed to fill the remaining hours required for graduation, depending on the courses chosen for the major.
Courses designated as general education core courses will not count toward a discipline area, regardless of whether or not the student is taking the course to meet a general education requirement.

The student may choose courses from any four of the following disciplines. The capstone course must be chosen from one of the four IDSTU.BA disciplines, in consultation with the faculty advisor.

Some disciplines allow any courses to fulfill specialty area requirements, while others have specific course requirements or tracks.
